Playground Card System

At Kaimhill School we want all children to have happy, positive times in our playground.

We know that sometimes all youngsters benefit from a little bit of help and motivation. To this end we are pleased to introduce our new Playground Card System.

There are 4 different cards that the pupils can receive; Green, Yellow, Orange and Red. All pupils should be aiming to receive the positive Green Cards.

WHY CARDS WILL BE ISSUED

Green Cards will be issued when children are demonstrating positive playground behaviour, such as being kind to their friends, helping others and playing appropriately.

Yellow Cards will be issued when children are, for example, teasing others and not listening to instructions given by adults.

Orange Cards will be issued when children are, for example, persistently not listening to adults and refusing to follow instructions.


Red Cards will be issued when children are, for example, physically hurting one another or vandalising property.

CONSEQUENCES

As we support our youngsters to develop key social skills at Kaimhill School we want them to understand that their behaviour, has a consequence for which they are responsible - both positive and negative behaviours.

GREEN CARDS

If your child receives a card you will be notified of this. Your child will be given a green slip which they will bring home to you. Please look out for these in school bags.



We will keep a record of the number of green slips each child gets.



YELLOW CARDS

If a child receives a yellow card, the Pupil Support Assistant (PSA) will give them a warning, and then will remove them from a situation by giving them time out on the bench in the playground.

ORANGE CARDS

If a child receives an orange card, the PSA will remove them from a situation by giving them time out on the bench in the playground and will inform the class teacher. The class teacher will keep a record of any orange card a child receives and if they receive 3 in any term they will lose 10 minutes from their Golden Time.

RED CARDS

If your child receives a red card, he or she will be removed from the playground and brought to a member of the management team who will deal with the situation accordingly.
