Literacy

This term we will be beginning to learn and recognise the first set of lowercase letters and sounds (satnip). We will also be learning how to form these letters correctly.

As we learn the sounds we will begin to blend them together to make, say and read words.

In addition to learning sounds, we will be focusing on our ability to hear, say and recognise rhyme by working on a different nursery rhyme in class each week. We will also build on our ability to recognise word boundaries and syllables.

Numeracy

In Term 1 we will be focusing on counting and sequencing numbers 0 – 10 and forming the numbers correctly.

In our "Big Maths" we will be beginning to grow our doubling knowledge through our "Learn It's": 1+1, 2+2, 3+3, 4+4, 5+5.

As well as working with number, we will be learning about 2D shapes, pattern and an introduction to measurement concentrating on the words longer, shorter, taller, heavier, more and less.
