5. Parking	There continues to be examples of dangerous driving and parking	
	at the school gates. The painting of zig zag lines at Two Mile

	Councillor Yuill observed that children at Airyhall had worked	

	with the police and produced artwork and perhaps our children could do something similar? Charlotte agreed to work on this with her Community Group Cog. Mr Chapisa commented that all parents need to take responsibility for the safety of children and should be challenging each other when dangerous practice is observed. There is also a problem with mainly older boys running across the road, and indeed there was nearly a serious incident at going home time today. Susie advised that road safety is reiterated in school, and asked to be kept updated about any issues.
